Rights At The Time Of Arrest

The Constitution of the Maldives (Article 48) provides an individual with the following rights at the time of arrest:

- a) Right to be informed immediately of the reasons of arrest, and in writing within at least twenty four hours
- b) Right to retain and instruct legal counsel without delay
- c) Right to remain silent*, except to establish one's identity
- d) Right to be brought before a Judge within twenty four hours
