In February 2020, National Preventive Mechanism (NPM) of the Commission conducted an inspection trip to the newly established National Reintegration Center upon the request of Maldives Police Service. After the visit, total of four recommendations were provided to the relevant state institutions including recommendations to develop Standard Operating Procedures. In October 2020, once the center was declared as a facility for detention under state care, NPM conducted a follow up visit in early November 2020 to monitor the implementations of the provided recommendations. However, it was noticed that none of the recommendations were implemented. This includes recommendation to develop guidelines, regulations, standard operating procedures and emergency response plan. In February 2022, NPM conducted a visit to the National Reintegration Center as per a request from Ministry of Home Affairs to monitor the center

Activity: Capacity-building assistance for investigators working for the National Integrity Commission. 	• To include capacity building assistance for investigators working at the Human Rights Commission of the Maldives. The Commission is mandated to investigate cases under Law Number 13/2013 (Anti- Torture Act), whereby a police officer is accused of exercising special powers which resulted in the torture of a suspect or a detainee.	
	- Support the National Integrity Committee and Strengthen the role of the "241 Committee" of Parliamentarians on National Security Services to ensure robust oversight and accountability of law enforcement agencies.
